Maths

Revision of 2D shapes

Provide loops made from string or elastic up to 1m long. Ask your child to make shapes with their loops.

Discuss with them how are they going to create the shape.

Encourage them to make a square, circle, triangle and rectangle.

Ask: How will they keep the edges pinned? What if something was different?

I like your shape, I

wonder how you could change it? What would you like to do next?

(This is all part of the reasoning behind Maths that needs to be developed).

Vocabulary: curved, rounded, pointy, bigger, smaller, longer, shorter, corner, like, different, side, curve.

Recording

Make a small drawing of your shapes on paper. You will need a few of each shape.

Sports Morning

Patterns using 2D shapes and extensions

Look at the shapes you made on Monday.

The Activity

Children create and continue an AB repeating pattern with two of the shapes they made on Monday.

Reasoning

What is the same and what is different about this one and your copy?

I wonder which one goes next? I think the next one is ...
What is the pattern called?
What is the rule for your pattern?

Development and Variation

Provide more complex repeating patterns: ABC, ABB, ABCD. Vary the materials and media, indoors and out.

Make action or sound patterns and record them with invented symbols.

Revision of 3D shapes

In a bag have various everyday objects of different 3D shapes. (cylinder tins, cube boxes, spheres, cuboid boxes etc)

The Activity

Children put their hand in the bag to choose one of the shapes inside. By exploring the shape with their hand while it is still in the bag, they try to reason what shape it is, then bring it out to see their choice.

Reasoning

Tell me about the shape you have found.

Why do you think it could be a ...?

Is there another shape it could be?

Development and Variation

Put a few examples of shapes with the same name into the bag. Can you find others in the bag that have the same name? How many are there that have the same name?

Record by sorting and labelling the sets with the name of the shape.

Recognition of 2d shapes as faces of 3D shapes.

You will need playdough or some powder. This activity can be done outside or somewhere that can be cleaned easily.

Using the 3D shapes from the previous session, press the shape into the dough or powder and look at the shape it has made. Tell your child that this is called its face. (Cube should be a square, cylinder should be a circle etc)
Tell your child that they are going to make a path from the shapes.

Reasoning

Tell me about your paths. Why did you put ... next to the ...? Is there a pattern to your path? What could you put after the ...?

Encourage them to be creative.

Record by drawing or a photo.

Reinforce the vocabulary 'face'
