

Make a clock and tell the time when things happen, eg, breakfast, Joe Wicks PE, lunch, dinner, Etc. Look at your homemade clock, Show that every number is an hour. Make up time questions (Focus on O'CLOCK). Make shakers by putting pasta, Lego, or something similar in a box, tin, etc. Play the song again and join in with your own instrument.</p>	<p>Art Create a character, or two, from Jack and the Beanstalk story using an empty toilet roll. Create and decorate it with felt pens, biro, paints or anything else you like. Use it to tell the story or join in with the song.</p>	<p>P.E. Join in with Joe Wicks on TV each morning.
